<u>Workshop 1</u>: Identifying our research traditions' complementarity and specific features: a practical exercise – 19th February 2024, Cologne (Germany)

The pedagogical objective of this workshop will be to make the students/young researchers aware of the diversity of approaches regarding lithic studies and their complementarity while encouraging them to open up and engage in a European dialogue. After preparation based on the study of an archaeological collection following the French research tradition (technological approach) and the German research tradition (SAP system), the proposed workshop will compare the two approaches.

Schedule:

9h-11h – Results of the analysis of the archaeological collection according to the two analysis methods (SAP versus technological analysis)

11h-13h – Observation of analysis criteria on archaeological material

14h30-17h – Set up 4 thematic working groups (raw materials, production methods, tools, databases): identify the complementary and specific features of each tradition. Restitution of the work through short presentations
